

# Does your group require funding?

If you are involved with a community group in your area, a grant from The Suffolk Foundation could help to support your cause

**The Port Community Fund:** Grants of up to £2,000 for charitable, voluntary and community groups addressing the needs of residents in Felixstowe and the immediate surrounding area.

**Improve and Prove Fund:** A grant of up to £5,000 towards financial self sustainability. To create a situation where there is less reliance on grant funding.

**Creating the Greenest County:** Grants of up to £25,000 for voluntary and community groups who wish to deliver community based carbon reduction projects that are 'visionary' and forward thinking in line with the Greenest County mission. Typical projects are heating systems that will use less carbon.

**The High Sheriff Fund:** Grants of up to £1,500 for work with young people (aged 8-25) that addresses citizenship, community safety and crime prevention

**Transforming Suffolk:** Grants of up to £5,000 to groups to carry out projects that meet one of the four themes of the fund. The themes are:- active, healthy and inclusive societies, a greener Suffolk, creating a vibrant economy, and work and life skills for the future.

**The Suffolk Fund:** Grants of up to £2,000 to charitable, voluntary and community groups that address Suffolk's priority needs, which include children and young people, the elderly, the disadvantaged (e.g., homelessness, low-income families, rural isolation), carers, racial and cultural integration and health and wellbeing (e.g., mental health issues, drug and alcohol misuse, disabilities, domestic violence).
